Defrost/Defog Windshield

Using The Heating/Ventilation System To Defrost Or Defog The Windshield:



To Remove Interior Fog On The Windshield:

- Set the airflow control to the defrost () position. (The A/C will turn on automatically and "Fresh" mode will be activated).
- Set the temperature control to the desired position.
- Set the fan speed control to "3" or "4".

To Remove Frost Or Exterior Fog On The Windshield:

- Set the airflow control to the defrost () position. (The A/C will turn on automatically and "Fresh" mode will be activated.)
- Set the temperature control to warm.
- Set the fan speed control to position "3" or "4".



Tire Inflation

Check tire pressure at least once a month when the tires are cold. Refer to the tire pressure label located on the driver's door opening for correct pressure.



Defrost/Defog Windshield (if installed)



The front window deicer is turned on by pushing the switch. The deicer is useful for melting the ice around the windshield wipers.

- To turn the deicer off, push the switch a second time.
- The deicer automaticaly turns itself off after several minutes.




Fuel Cap



After adding fuel, always reinstall the fuel cap fully and make sure it clicks at least 3 times. Failure to do this may result in the "Check Engine Light" illuminating.



Right Front Seatback Table



Seatback table operation:

- 1. Lower the headrest.
- 2. Pull the recliner control lever & push the seatback forward.

Note: Do not use the seatback table while driving.

3. Supplemental Restraint System (AirBag) Service Reminder Indicator (SRI)







Tailgate open:

Pull and raise the "DOOR" release lever (left side) to open the tailgate.



Tailgate window open:


- 1. Pull the "GLASS" release lever (right side).
- 2. Raise the window open handle.

Note: The hatch must be unlocked to open the tailgate or window.




Audio Antenna

The audio antenna is movable. For optimal reception, always make sure that your antenna is in the upright position.



Note: The antenna mast may be laid down flat when carrying over-size objects such as skis or surfboards.



Rear Center Seatbelt:

- 1. Confirm that the metal tab (a) and buckle (b) are latched together.
- 2. Pull the seat belt out of the retractor and insert the metal tab (c) into the buckle (d).

To stow shoulder belt. insert key into slot to release metal tab (a).



Rear Seat Recline

To recline or fold the rear seats, pull the seatback-folding lever.



- The 4WD system assists when driving on wet pavement, snow-covered roads, and/or offroad conditions.
- Press the 4WD lock switch for full time 4WD engagement.
- The 4WD indicator light will illuminate when the system is active.

Note: Do not drive the 4WD Tucson in 4WD Lock mode on dry pavement.

Keyless Remote and Locks





- A. Press UNLOCK on the transmitter to disarm the alarm and unlock the driver's door. Press UNLOCK again within 4 seconds to unlock all the doors.
- B. Press LOCK on the transmitter to lock all the doors and arm the alarm. Press LOCK again with in 4 seconds to hear a confirmation chirp.
- C. Press PANIC on the transmitter to activate the horn and flashing lights for 30 seconds. Press PANIC again to turn off the horn and flashing lights.
