REMOTE KEYLESS ENTRY





- Unlock
- Tailgate unlock (press and hold)
- Panic (press and hold)

Driver's door Lock/Unlock

Smart key must be within range.

Press:

One Time – Unlock driver door Two Time – (in 4 seconds) Unlock all doors Three Time – Lock all doors

Remove mechanical key

Press and hold the release (A) button and remove the key.

Reinstall mechanical key

Put the key into the key slot and push it until a click sound is heard.

ENGINE START/STOP BUTTON



With the ignition OFF, press the engine start/stop button:

- Once for ACC (Accessory) mode.
- Twice for ON mode.
- Three times for OFF.

To start the engine, press the start/stop button while:

• Manual Transmission: depressing the clutch and brake pedal.

To shut engine OFF, shift to:

• Manual Transmission: Select Neutral, apply the hand brake, and press the start/stop button.

Emergency situations

• Shut off engine while driving:

Press engine start/stop button for more than 2 seconds or press it 3 times consecutively within 3 seconds.

• **Restart engine while driving:** Press engine start/stop button with shift lever in N (Neutral).

FRONT SEAT ADJUSTMENT





HEADREST ADJUSTMENT





To Raise Headrest: Pull headrest up.

To Lower Headrest: Press lock knob while pressing down on headrest.

NOTE

To avoid discomfort during long drives, adjust the seat back angle further back so the headrest does not become uncomfortable from contact with the driver's head.

SEAT BELT ADJUSTMENT (Driver's Front seat)



Set the belt extension guide to one of the 3 positions when using the seat belt.

FUEL DOOR





- 1. To open fuel door, pull lever upward
- 2. Rotate the fuel cap counter clockwise to open.

NOTE

After adding fuel, always reinstall the fuel cap onto the filler neck by rotating it clockwise until it clicks once.

Failure to do this may result in the Check Engine Light (C1) illuminating.

DRIVER'S MAIN CONTROLS

BLUETOOTH OPERATIONAL TIPS

In the following situations you or the other party may have difficulty hearing each other:

- 1. When the Bluetooth volume is at a high level. To reduce echo and distortion, try lowering the volume.
- 2. When driving on a rough road, high speeds and/or with the window open.
- 3. When the air conditioning vents are facing the microphone and/or when the air conditioning fan is at the max speed.

VOICE RECOGNITION TIPS

Your vehicle is equipped with Voice Recognition technology, which allows drivers to operate their phones without having to take their eyes off the road to minimize distractions.

Voice recognition performance may be affected if driving with windows and sunroof open; when the heating-cooling system is on; when passing through a tunnel or when driving on rugged and uneven roads.

Quick reference on using voice commands

CURRENT CARPLAY AUDIO PLAYING

SIRI

Apple CarPlay uses Siri to perform many actions like sending messages, placing calls, and looking up/setting POI/Destinations. A Siri session can be initiated on any screen by:

- 1. Touch and holding the HOME icon 1 on the CarPlay screen or
- 2. Press the steering wheel VOICE RECOGNITION (3) button.

Note: Ensure Siri feature is set to ON in your phone (Go to Settings > Siri).

3. Say any of the following commands;

- "Text < John Smith> 'Call you later'" to send a text message.
- "Read text messages" to read available text message.
- "Call < John Smith>" to make a phone call.
- "Find <POI/Destination>" to locate a POI/Destination.

PHONE

Touch the PHONE **5** icon to access the Phone screen. Siri will automatically asks 'Who do you want to call' when the PHONE **5** icon is selected.

NOTE: Phone call sound quality is dependent on the wired connection. Using the Lightning cable that came with the phone is recommended.

APPLE MUSIC

MESSAGES

Shifting into Reverse

- 1. Fully depress the clutch 🛽
- 2. Shift into Neutral **B**
- 3. Pull up on the reverse lockout collar below the shift knob 🔘
- 4. Shift into Reverse **D**

CRUISE CONTROL



The Cruise Control system allows you to program the vehicle to maintain a constant speed without pressing the accelerator pedal.

- 1 Push CRUISE button to turn cruise control ON/OFF.
- 2 Push the toggle switch UP to resume or increase cruise control speed.
- 3 Push the toggle switch DOWN to set or decrease the cruise control speed.
- 4 Push CANCEL to cancel cruise control.

Setting Cruise Control

- 1. Press the "CRUISE" button 1 to turn on Cruise Control. The icon will illuminate in the instrument cluster.
- 2. Toggle "-SET" switch (3) DOWN to set cruising speed.

Adjusting the vehicle speed

- 1. Toggle "+RES" switch 2 UP to increase cruising speed.
- 2. Toggle "-SET" switch 3 DOWN to decrease cruising speed.

Note

Quick toggle up/down will change speed by 1 mph. Holding switch up/ down will change speed by 5 mph.

To Cancel Cruise Control

Press the "CANCEL" button 4 or depress the brake pedal.

REARVIEW CAMERA



The rearview camera will activate when the ignition switch is ON and the shift lever is in the R (Reverse) position.



When the gear shift lever is shifted into reverse (R), the rearview camera displays the area behind the vehicle.

NOTE

The image displayed on the screen may become difficult to see under the following conditions:

- In the dark or at night.

- When it is raining, or when water droplets are on the camera.

- When the sun or the beam of headlights are shining into the camera lens. Use care to keep the camera lens clean and avoid applying any type of solvents, car wax, or window cleaners to the camera lens. If the lens becomes dirty, wipe the lens with a clean, soft cloth.

Low Tire Pressure Position Indicator and Tire Pressure Indicator (shown on the LCD display)

LOW TIRE PRESSURE INDICATOR

Illuminates if one or more of your tires are significantly under-inflated.

TPMS MALFUNCTION INDICATOR

Blinks for approximately one minute, then remains illuminated when there is a malfunction with the TPMS. Inspect all tires and adjust the tire pressure to specification. If the lamp remains illuminated, have the system checked by an authorized HYUNDAI dealer as soon as possible.

LOW TIRE PRESSURE POSITION INDICATOR AND TIRE PRESSURE INDICATOR (LCD DISPLAY)

Tire pressures will display after driving a short distance. If a tire pressure drops lower than predetermined specification, the Low Tire Pressure Indicator (!) will illuminate and the LCD Time display will indicate tire(s) requiring air.

The Tire Specification and Pressure Label located on the driver's side center pillar gives the tire pressures recommended for your car.

NOTE

Environmental factors can affect the tire pressure. The two main environmental factors are ambient air temperature and elevation. Colder ambient air will reduce tire pressure, while hotter ambient air will increase tire pressure. High elevation may also increase tire pressure.

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VELOSTER N
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ELECTRONIC STABILITY CONTROL (ESC)



The ESC system is an electronic system designed to help the driver maintain vehicle control under adverse conditions.

Press 🛃 to turn ESC on or off.

SHIFT LIGHT



The number of LEDs illuminated indicates the relevant engine speed Different colored LEDs will be illuminated as engine speed nears the maximum allowed speed. When all 5 LEDs start blinking, it indicates the best time to initiate upshift operation.

You may select in which mode to display the gear shift indicator in the User Settings mode.

Go to 'User Settings \rightarrow Convenience \rightarrow Shift Lights \rightarrow ECO/NORMAL/ SPORT/N/CUSTOM'.

Each gear and drive mode has different LED operation range. In SPORT mode and N mode, LED operation is broader than NORMAL mode and ECO mode to further support the driver under sporty or track driving conditions.

REV MATCH



The Rev Matching system automatically helps synchronize engine rpm with the optimal speed of the gear about to be engaged which reduces the impact of clutch connection and improves gear shift response.

1. Press REV button (ON/OFF)

- Press the REV button to turn on the system. A message appears "Rev Matching On" with a REV indicator on the cluster LCD display.
- Press the REV button again to turn off the system. A message appears "Rev Matching Off" and the REV indicator disappears.

The Blind-Spot Collision-Avoidance Assist (BCA) system may apply braking power, when an approaching vehicle is detected within a certain distance next to or behind your vehicle. The instrument cluster will inform the driver of activation. Press the Blind-Spot switch. The indicator will illuminate on the button. If vehicle speed exceeds 40mph the system will activate. Press the switch again to deactivate the system.

Blind spot collision warning (BCW)

Warning range is dependent on your vehicle speed. Example, if your vehicle speed is 20 mph greater than other vehicles, the warning is not active.

Blind spot collision avoidance (BCA)

When changing lanes, the system detects the front lane through the camera installed on the windshield and detects the side/rear areas through radar sensors.

MEMO

DRIVE MODE



The drive mode may be selected according to the driver's preference or road condition.

The system resets to be in the NORMAL mode, when the engine is restarted.

ECO - the engine control is changed to maximize fuel efficiency.

SPORT - manage driving dynamics by automatically adjusting the steering effort, engine and chassis control for enhanced driving performance. The fuel efficiency may decrease.

N BUTTON



N mode selects the proper driving mode among SPORT and SPORT+ for each components that will effect the performance of a high-performance vehicle.

- When N mode is selected by pressing the N button. the N indicator will illuminate.
- N mode (SPORT/SPORT+) manages the driving dynamics by automatically adjusting the steering effort, and the engine and chassis control logic for enhanced driver performance.
